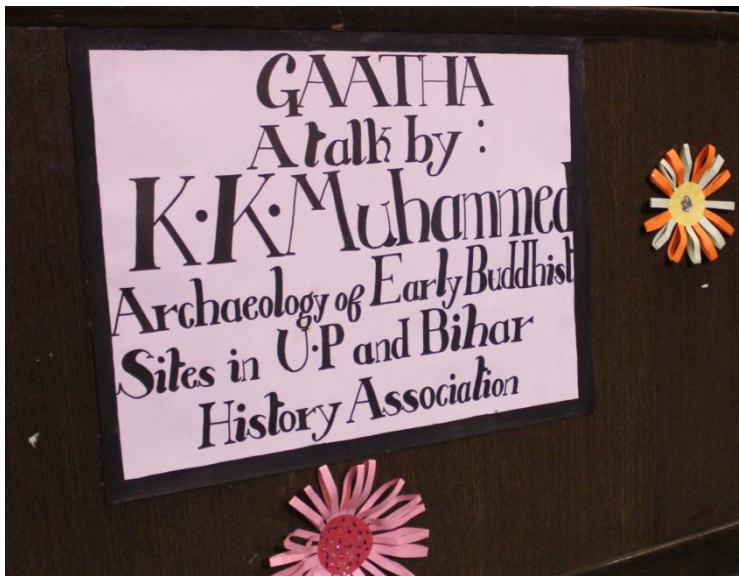


**Talk by Mr. K.K. Muhammad**
